1.4 Whether there is any revision/update of regulation or syllabi, if yes, mention their salient aspects.

Goa university has decided to implement CBCS from 2017-18. Hence Syllabi updating/revision going on.

The regulations of the affiliating University prohibits individual colleges from revising syllabi. However, syllabi of the University are updated regularly, in some cases, every three years, and our faculty are a part and parcel of the revision process [by being members of BOS, participants at workshops organized for updation of syllabi and through communication with the university regarding the positive changes that need to be incorporated to keep the syllabi USER-URGENT, USER-FRIENDLY AND USER-RELEVANT. We were a part of the process of syllabi updation/revision by the Goa University with a view to shift to CBCS from 2017-18. Inputs from all stakeholders were invited. Accordingly syllabus has been prepared and the winds of changes have started blowing. Once the modalities have been worked out and technical issues have been taken care of, CBCS will replace present Semester system in a phased manner.

[To mention sample salient features of syllabi, our BUSINESS COMMUNICATION Syllabus consists of Digital Story Telling (DST), Actual filing of RTI Applications, Presentations using Zen, Rockstar, Slido:logy, Prezi Online Zooming Editor, Camtasia, Mindmapping, Pecha Kucha, Ignite etc., Video CVs & Presume, Creation of Free Websites using Wix, Blogging, Social Networking sites and Blogging ensuring that our students remain academically advanced and excited about what they do and how they do it.]

IGNOU STUDY CENTRE:

Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) was established in 1985 to democratize higher education. The aim was to provide cost-effective, quality education to large sections of our population including those living in remote and far flung areas. A mere fifteen years since its inception IGNOU has carved a niche for itself among the premier educational institutions in the country. The University has been a pioneer in Distance Education and the recipient of the Centre of Excellence in Distance Education award conferred by the Commonwealth of Learning in 1993. IGNOU is a Central University established by an act of Parliament in 1985 (Act No.50 of 1985) IGNOU Degrees/ Diplomas /Certificates are recognized by all member Universities of Association of Indian Universities (AIU) and are at par with Degrees / Diplomas /Certificates of all Indian Universities/Deemed Universities/Institutions vide UGC Circular No. F1-52/2000 (CPP-II) dated 5th May, 2004 & AIU Circular No. EV/B (449)/94/177115 dated January 14, 1994.

As a part of Community Development Initiative, and providing learning opportunities, and reaching out to those who missed College Education, our College has started IGNOU STUDY CENTRE (08025) from the academic year 2015-16 with an objective of access to high quality education to all those who seek it irrespective of age, region or formal qualification by distance mode. 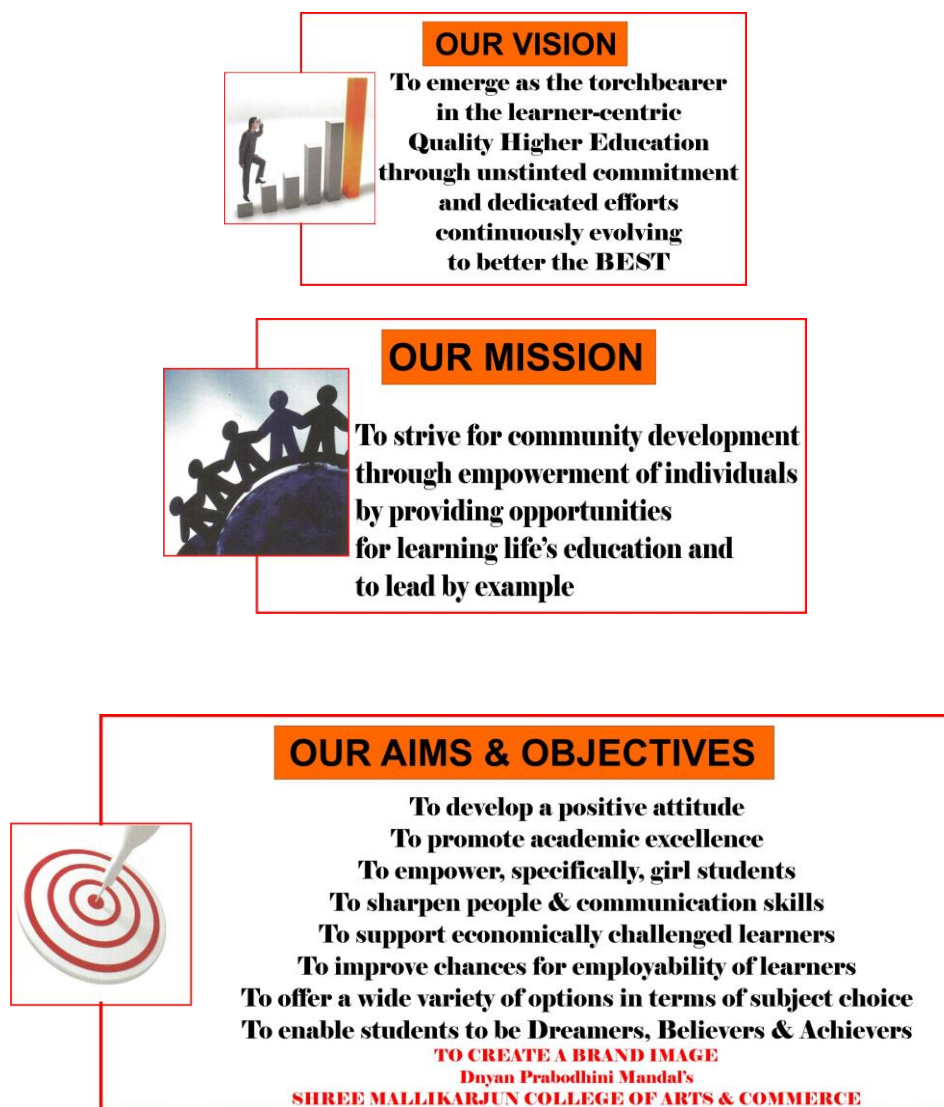
