1.4 Whether there is any revision/update of regulation or syllabi, if yes, mention their salient aspects.

Not just the syllabi but the entire system has been revamped. Goa University has adopted CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM [CBCS] from the Academic Year 2017-18. The SEMESTER SYSTEM has been adopted. It is being implemented in a phased manner. The SYLLABI of all courses are being revised accordingly. New Programs in HONORS are a salient feature of this CBCS System. It is possible now for students to move on to the next semester with backlogs. This decreases the rate of drop-outs. The CBCS system has opened avenues for INTER-DEPARTMENTAL OR INTER-COLLEGIATE MOBILITY due to the credit system. The Course Heads being Discipline Specific, AECC & General Elective more options are being generated. The CBCS System has, more importantly, paved the way for INTER-DISCIPLINARY MOBILTY allowing for example, students of XII Arts to opt for B.Sc. or B.Com. Programs. Proficiency Tests and Bridge Courses are in place for Competency-building of such students.

It is pertinent to note that though it is the responsibility of BOS to update syllabi regularly, it is a custom to form **BOS Sub-Committees** to involve most of the faculty across colleges in the updation process. Goa University has also gone one step ahead and has invited suggestions and recommendations not only from the faculty but also from other stakeholders viz. Students, Alumni, Parents and, most importantly, from Industry to ensure that the syllabi is USER URGENT, USER FRIENDLY AND USER RELEVENT. The CBCS is enabling students to be Career-ready.

The college has signed MoU with the NGO SANGATH under the Department of Sociology to provide mental health care in the taluka of Canacona. It is completely funded by SANGATH. The Certified Mental Health Counsellors are providing counselling and guidance for people through house visits, meeting with anganwadi workers, healthcare professionals. Out of the five centres, one is located in the college itself.

2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

The college has adopted the **4-Ps Model** (Product, Process, Position, Paradigm) developed by John Bessant and Joe Tidd which emphasizes that successful innovation is about **Positive Change**. While some innovative processes that are serving the purposes are continued, more are being added and adopted. Innovation is also brought into the practices and processes in place using creative mind-set which 'sees what everyone has seen and thinks what no one has thought'.

The innovative processes adopted under the four broad categories are:

- 1 A Rally was taken out in Canacona Market along with other Educational Institute in the taluka against the use of drugs on 29/06/2017.
- 2. Awareness drive against Vector Born Diseases at Pallolem village was taken up in collaboration with Community Health Centre, Canacona on 12/08/2017.
- 3. On 15/08/2017 Gaondongrium village and Bamanbudo waterfall were cleaned by the 30 students.

4. Canacona Bus Stand, Railway Station and Pallolem Beach were cleaned by 81 students along with three teachers on 23/09/2017.

#### 5. Swachh Gandhi Jayanti Celebration

Mahatma Gandhi Jayanti of this year i.e. 2017 is celebrated as **SWACHH GANDHI JAYANTI** on the call given by the Prme Minister of India. On the occasion of Gandhiji and Shashriji Jayanti, a special programme was organized to pay homage to Gandhiji and Shastriji. Dr. Jagmohan Singh Senior Faculty of the College spoke on the occasion. Dr. F. M. Nadaf, Principal of the College, addressed the staff and students and highlighted the role played by Gandhiji in cleanliness.

As a part of Gandhi Jayanti class room cleaning drive followed by peace rally was undertaken by the NSS Volunteers. In all 211 students comprising 60 male volunteers and 151 female volunteers participated in this mission.

The sanitation and health survey cum awareness drive was launched on this ocasion. The purpose of the survey is to know the extent and use of toilet facilities, soaking pits and clean water facilities.

6. Active Participation in Swatchh Bharat Abhiyan

#### 7 Swatchh Bharat Pakhwada

The observance of Swatchh Bharat Pakhwada started in our Institute on 1st August 2017 by rally, class cleaning and oath administering ceremony. A group of 50 volunteers (Male- 22 Female- 28) with NSS Programme Officers conducted rally in the college campus and visited each class. With the permission of teacher therein, classes were cleaned by the volunteers. In each class, the Programme Officer, Dr. Geeta Walvekar, elaborated the purpose of conducting such drive and also requested all the students to join their hands for success of Swatchh Bharat Mission. Volunteers selected from each class administered oath to respective class students and received overwhelming response from them.

On 2nd August 2017, 'Swatchhta through Tree Plantation' programme was conducted. At the hands of Chief Guest, Shri. Shivram Desai, ZAO Canacona, medicinal plants were planted in the college campus. In all 142 volunteers (Males – 55 and Females – 87) participated to plant 333 saplings in college campus as well as in villages.

Under the theme of 'Drive against Plastic', a workshop on 'making paper bags' was conducted on 3rd August. The principal Dr. F. M. Nadaf as a Resource Person enlightened volunteers on the menace of plastics and encouraged them to use cloth and paper bags. The Resource Person demonstrated the skill of making bags from newspaper and helped volunteers in making the same. Volunteers enjoyed making paper bags and decided to make and distribute 1 lakh paper bags during the year. Altogether 72 volunteers (Males- 31 and Females- 41) participated in the programme.

A team of 45 volunteers consisting 15 boys and 30 girls participated in the campus cleaning drive on 4th August 2017.

Campus beautification work was carried out by the NSS volunteers on 5th August involving participation of 50 volunteers (Males- 22 and Females- 28)

On 8th August 2017 a talk on the topic of 'Vector Borne Diseases - causes and impacts' was organized in the college auditorium to spread the awareness about cleanliness in our surrounding.

#### 8 Armed Forces Fund Collection

NSS volunteers collected 5037/- (Rupees Five Thousand Thirty Seven only) by selling armed forces stamps to the public and deposited the same with Department of Sainik Welfare, Government of Goa.

#### 9 Legal Service Camp

A mega Legal Service Camp was organised on 16<sup>th</sup> March 2018 by Legal Services Canacona to provide legal aid to the citizens of the taluka. Our NSS volunteers volunteered their services to the cause of this social service.

#### 10 Swatchta Hi Seva

The Hon'ble Prime Minister called upon the nation to begin a campaign, Swachhata Hi Seva, Cleanliness is Service, from 15<sup>th</sup> September 2017 to Gandhi Jayanti on 2nd October 2017 to create an environment of cleanliness in the entire country so that the coming 2nd October, the third anniversary of the Swachh Bharat Mission and Gandhi Jayanti, can be celebrated in a befitting manner. He urged all NGOs, schools, colleges, social, cultural and political leaders, corporates, government officials, Collectors and sarpanches, to accelerate Swachhata activities during the above mentioned period. To be part of the same, the NSS Unit observed SWATCHATA HI SEVA PAKHWADA from 15th September 2017 to Gandhi Jayanti on 2nd October 2017. During the Pakawada following cleanliness drives were organized at various locations in Canacona taluka.

- 11 Road Safety Awareness: To bring awareness on road safety the 'Road Safety Week' was observed from 5<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> February 2018 by organising talks by Police Inspector, Canacona and by displaying the traffic signals at different places.
- 12 A survey on Leprosy Awareness was conducted in five villages of *Agonda, Khola, Mastimol, Rajbagh* and *Tarir* by 11 NSS volunteers.
- 13. Drive against the use of plastic bags was carried out in which 71 NSS volunteers participated throughout the year. Three workshops on "How to Make Paper Bags' were conducted on 2<sup>nd</sup> August and 26<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup> September 2017 in which students were taught to make these bags. Forty five thousands paper bags were made and distributed among the shopkeepers at Canacona, Chaudi market.

Kelekar "Women empowerment in India" by Mrs. Mala Nayak (retired JNV teacher)
"Significance of Media" by Shri. Subhash Mohale (teacher Sharadhanand Vidhyalaya).

- 3 RAKHI AND LAMP SELLING (prepared by special school 'LOKVISHWAS PRATISTHAN' children): Exhibition of the handmade rakhees and lamps by special school children was put up for sale in the college.
- 4 Entrepreneurship Development Program for Rural Women of Cotigaon Village Panchayat organized in association with Extra Mural and Extension Service of Goa University on 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2018. About 200 women entrepreneurs of Cotigao village panchayat participated in the day long workshop.
- 5 Three day workshop on "VEDIC MATHS" for the students and staff of Government School Balli, Quepem by the Department of Mathematics
- 6 Canacona Taluka Culinary Art for the students of Schools and Higher Secondary Schools by the Department of History and Women Forum.

#### 7. MEGA CULTURAL EVENT: RASHTRA EKTA KI AWAAZ

Our College in association with the Directorate of Art & Culture, Government of Goa, West Cultural Zone, Udaipur and Citizens of Canacona taluka organized 'RASHTRA EKTA KI AWAAZ' on the eve of Republic Day on 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> January 2018. This event was expected to be attended by about 7000 students, youth, and general public.

This was an unique experiment to showcase our unity and diversity, communal harmony, rich cultural heritage, homage to national leaders, and bring all educational and socio cultural institutions of Canacona taluka on one platform in a spirit of EKTA and ignite the spirit of nationalism, patriotism, brotherhood and uphold the secular fabric of our Constitution.

- 1 A Rally was taken out in Canacona Market along with other Educational Institute in the taluka against the use of drugs on 29/06/2017.
- 2. Awareness drive against Vector Born Diseases at Pallolem village was taken up in collaboration with Community Health Centre, Canacona on 12/08/2017.
- 3. On 15/08/2017 Gaondongrium village and Bamanbudo waterfall were cleaned by the 30 students.
- 4. Canacona Bus Stand, Railway Station and Pallolem Beach were cleaned by 81 students along with three teachers on 23/09/2017.
- 5. Swachh Gandhi Jayanti Celebration

Mahatma Gandhi Jayanti of this year i.e. 2017 is celebrated as **SWACHH GANDHI JAYANTI** on the call given by the Prme Minister of India. On the occasion of Gandhiji and Shashriji Jayanti, a special programme was organized to pay homage to Gandhiji and Shastriji. Dr. Jagmohan Singh Senior Faculty of the College spoke on the occasion. Dr. F. M. Nadaf, Principal of the College, addressed the staff and students and highlighted the role played by Gandhiji in cleanliness.

As a part of Gandhi Jayanti class room cleaning drive followed by peace rally was undertaken by the NSS Volunteers. In all 211 students comprising 60 male volunteers and 151 female volunteers participated in this mission.

The sanitation and health survey cum awareness drive was launched on this ocasion. The purpose of the survey is to know the extent and use of toilet facilities, soaking pits and clean water facilities.

6. Active Participation in Swatchh Bharat Abhiyan

#### 7 Swatchh Bharat Pakhwada

The observance of Swatchh Bharat Pakhwada started in our Institute on 1st August 2017 by rally, class cleaning and oath administering ceremony. A group of 50 volunteers (Male- 22 Female- 28) with NSS Programme Officers conducted rally in the college campus and visited each class. With the permission of teacher therein, classes were cleaned by the volunteers. In each class, the Programme Officer, Dr. Geeta Walvekar, elaborated the purpose of conducting such drive and also requested all the students to join their hands for success of Swatchh Bharat Mission. Volunteers selected from each class administered oath to respective class students and received overwhelming response from them.

On 2nd August 2017, 'Swatchhta through Tree Plantation' programme was conducted. At the hands of Chief Guest, Shri. Shivram Desai, ZAO Canacona, medicinal plants were planted in the college campus. In all 142 volunteers (Males – 55 and Females – 87) participated to plant 333 saplings in college campus as well as in villages.

Under the theme of 'Drive against Plastic', a workshop on 'making paper bags' was conducted on 3rd August. The principal Dr. F. M. Nadaf as a Resource Person enlightened volunteers on the menace of plastics and encouraged them to use cloth and paper bags. The Resource Person demonstrated the skill of making bags from newspaper and helped volunteers in making the

same. Volunteers enjoyed making paper bags and decided to make and distribute 1 lakh paper bags during the year. Altogether 72 volunteers (Males- 31 and Females- 41) participated in the programme.

A team of 45 volunteers consisting 15 boys and 30 girls participated in the campus cleaning drive on 4th August 2017.

Campus beautification work was carried out by the NSS volunteers on 5th August involving participation of 50 volunteers (Males- 22 and Females- 28)

On 8th August 2017 a talk on the topic of 'Vector Borne Diseases - causes and impacts' was organized in the college auditorium to spread the awareness about cleanliness in our surrounding.

#### 8 Armed Forces Fund Collection

NSS volunteers collected 5037/- (Rupees Five Thousand Thirty Seven only) by selling armed forces stamps to the public and deposited the same with Department of Sainik Welfare, Government of Goa.

# 9 Legal Service Camp

A mega Legal Service Camp was organised on 16<sup>th</sup> March 2018 by Legal Services Canacona to provide legal aid to the citizens of the taluka. Our NSS volunteers volunteered their services to the cause of this social service.

#### 10 Swatchta Hi Seva

The Hon'ble Prime Minister called upon the nation to begin a campaign, Swachhata Hi Seva, Cleanliness is Service, from 15<sup>th</sup> September 2017 to Gandhi Jayanti on 2nd October 2017 to create an environment of cleanliness in the entire country so that the coming 2nd October, the third anniversary of the Swachh Bharat Mission and Gandhi Jayanti, can be celebrated in a befitting manner. He urged all NGOs, schools, colleges, social, cultural and political leaders, corporates, government officials, Collectors and sarpanches, to accelerate Swachhata activities during the above mentioned period. To be part of the same, the NSS Unit observed SWATCHATA HI SEVA PAKHWADA from 15th September 2017 to Gandhi Jayanti on 2nd October 2017. During the Pakawada following cleanliness drives were organized at various locations in Canacona taluka.

- 11 Road Safety Awareness: To bring awareness on road safety the 'Road Safety Week' was observed from 5<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> February 2018 by organising talks by Police Inspector, Canacona and by displaying the traffic signals at different places.
