

A Visit to Sateri Self Help Group



Visit to Shree Santeri Self Help Group Gaval Khola

As a part of the curriculum a field visit was undertaken to Shree Santeri Self Help Group Gaval Khola self-help group of Gaval Khola, Cabo De Rama on 12.10.2018. Assistant Professor Mrs Viithai Zaruunker accompanied the students. Shree Sateri SHG is one of the oldest groups in the village Khola registered under the SHGs around eight years ago. This group consists of 17 members formed to help each other through their little collection and hard work inputs.

Functioning

It is learnt that the group conducts meetings once in a week and collects a sum of rupees fifty from every member a month. One of the members takes the responsibility of depositing the money in the bank. Apart from this, the members participate collectively in agricultural

tubers. These women are also active in the cultural domain. Their *fugdi*, *kalsi* and *divli* dances in the taluka and state competitions have brought them laurels in the cultural festivals like *Shigmo*.

The pooled money is used for purposes such as education of children, marriages, festivals such as Ganesh chaturthi, birthdays or in times when there is a dire need. They only give the loans to their group member's on interest @ Rs. 1 on Rs. 100. Some landless village men borrow land on rent. The rent on land cost is generally around rupees. 400, and is at times also determined as per the use of land. Thus, one may ascertain the fact that the Self Help Groups help the women in mobilising the resources and cultivating a spirit of collective participation.

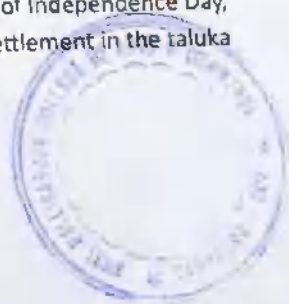


Adventure Camp

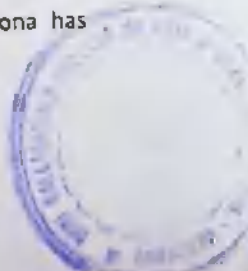
Kerala Flood Relief Fund collection

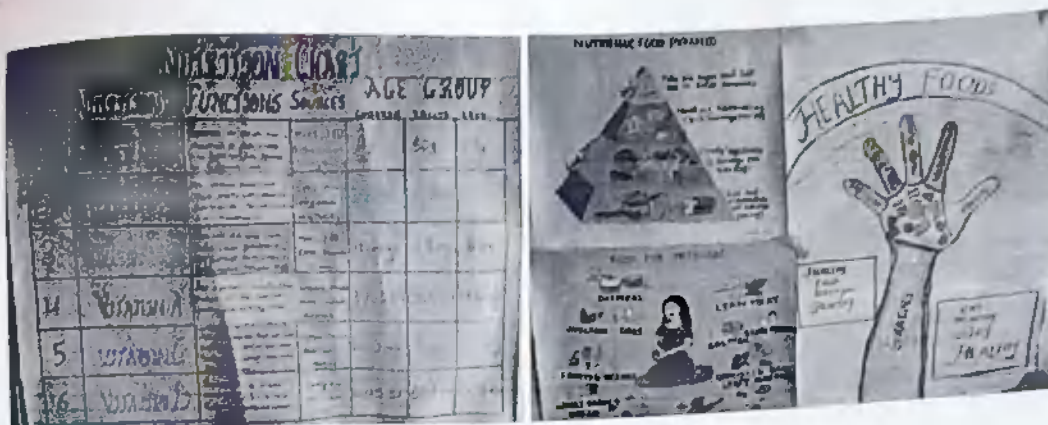
Participation in Inter-State Youth Exchange Programme

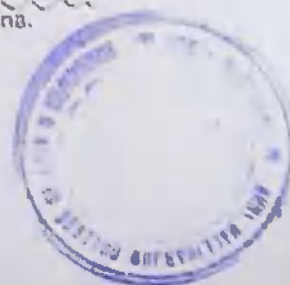
Participation in Youth Festival

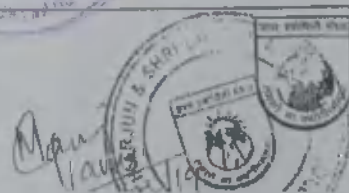
AND WHEREAS it has been considered expedient to agree in writing to participate jointly in undertaking students- and research projects as per the expertise and logistics available with the PARTIES.

Article 1. Objectives

- Minimum One Joint Minor Research Project (JMRP) in Identified area for a duration of two years.

3.3 Seminars and lectures on topics of mutual interest and relevance

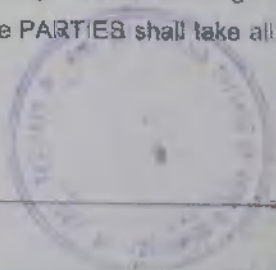
- A minimum Two Guest lectures in each academic year in the area of co-operation.

3.4 Community Outreach Programmes

Article 4. Exchange of Information and Research Samples

- 4.1 The term "information" includes scientific or technical data, results and/or methods of investigation, and other information intended to be provided, exchanged or arising under the objectives identified under Article 1. The PARTIES shall take all measures

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to protect the secrecy of and avoid disclosure and unauthorized use of the information which is confidential and outside the public domain.

- 4.2 Samples exchanged between the PARTIES shall not be transferred to any third party for research and commercial purposes and that the unutilized portions of such samples must be sent back to the concerned coordinators identified under Article 6.1.

Article 5. Publications and Intellectual Property Rights

- 5.1 Any research publications and intellectual property rights arising out of the students- and joint research projects shall be jointly published and, when patented, will be jointly and equally owned by PCC and SMC.
- 5.2 The procedural formalities for securing and maintaining the intellectual property rights shall be the responsibility of both PCC /SMC and the expenditure incurred thereof shall be borne jointly and equally by PCC and SMC.
- 5.3 The upfront fee and royalty accrued from licensing of any intellectual property arising from this collaboration to other PARTY [IES] shall be shared between the PARTIES, the terms and conditions of which shall be the subject matter of a separate agreement between the PARTIES.
- 5.4 The PARTIES shall not assign any rights and obligations to any third PARTY [IES] without consent of the other party.

Article 6. Implementation

- 6.1 The PARTIES agree to constitute an Advisory Committee as follows:

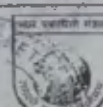

- 6.2 The Advisory Committee shall meet at least once in a year either at PCC or SMC to review the progress.
- 6.3 Based on the education, training and research requirements of students and staff, the advisory committee shall, in consultation with the faculty and scientists, decide on topics and the mode of cooperation for each of the academic years during the tenure of this cooperation.

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- 6.4 The convener and co-convener shall be the contact persons for all the cooperation and other related issues identified in this understanding.

Article 7. Finance

- 7.1 Each PARTY shall bear the respective costs of carrying out the obligations under this agreement. Neither PARTY shall make a claim against the other PARTY for any expenditure unless such expenditure has been agreed upon in writing between the PARTIES.

Article 8. General Provisions

- 8.1 Research instrumentation, infrastructure and library facilities available at the PARTIES work place(s) shall be made available to the scientists, faculty, research scholars and students of the PARTIES.
- 8.2 The PARTIES shall not use any of the confidential information which is required to be held in confidence for any purpose other than performance of their obligations under this understanding.
- 8.3 The implementation of the areas- and forms of cooperation identified under Articles 2 and 3 shall be subject to the availability and convenience of research students, faculties and infrastructure facilities available at the PARTIES work places.
- 8.4 The PARTY organizing an item of work shall have the nodal responsibility for mobilizing resources and the conduct of such works.
- 8.5 There shall be exchange visits by faculty members for academic and research purposes.
- 8.6 There shall be exchanges of students between both the parties with the convenience of both the parties so that students can be benefited by the good teachers of both parties.
- 8.7 All questions related to this understanding arising during its term shall be settled by the PARTIES by mutual agreement. The disagreements at the operating level shall be forwarded to the respective higher officials for appropriate resolution failing which an arbitrator of mutual acceptance may be identified.

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8.8 Nothing in this understanding is intended to affect other cooperation or collaboration between the PARTIES.

- C. The Second Party hereby permits RJIL to occupy and use the space provided at various locations in the Premises to provide various telecommunication services as per the terms and conditions mentioned hereunder.

NOW THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH AS UNDER

1. RIGHTS GRANTED

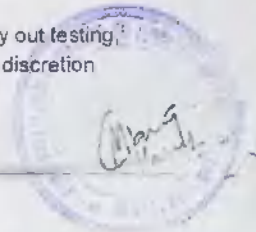
- 1.1. The Agreement shall be renewed with mutual consent of the parties after the expiry of the initial term for a term equivalent to the initial term and the Parties shall execute a separate Agreement on same terms and conditions to record the renewal of the Agreement.
- 2.2. The **FIRST** Party shall pay to the **SECOND** Party an utility and electricity charges of **FOC**

3. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF RJIL

- 3.1. To install, commission, operate and maintain telecom equipment, poles, including but not limited to laying of cables, at the roof top, terrace or locations in the Premises and at any additional locations as per feasibility and requirement of RJIL in future without damaging existing structure of Second Party (hereinafter referred to as "**Site Locations**"). Further, the First Party will undertake upgrade the installed telecom equipments due to change in the technology at its own cost.
- 3.2. To provide various telecommunication services in compliance with the terms and conditions of Unified License referred in Clause A, as well as per guidelines issued by various Government and Regulatory Authorities, and other applicable laws
- 3.3. To restrict or suspend access to its telecommunication services in order to carry out testing, technical repair, maintenance, upgrade, or for any other reason at RJIL's sole discretion

- to determine pricing and tariff planning or telecommunication services availed by Customers, and any change therein
- 3.5. To address the queries and concerns of the Customers about the telecommunication services
 - 3.6. To retain ownership and control of all Digital spaces, customer details and usage information, including but not limited to Landing Page(s), Login Flow Page(s) and RJIL website(s),
 - 3.7. To be the provider of telecommunication services through any telecom equipment(s) being installed at the Premises,
 - 3.8. To assign or transfer the rights and obligations under this Agreement in favour of any of its associate companies, subsidiaries or affiliates, or any other person(s) or entity(ies) with a written Confirmation from the Second Party. Affiliates shall mean any person directly or indirectly controlling, controlled by or under direct or indirect common control with RJIL

4. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF SECOND PARTY

- 4.1. To provide exclusive permission to RJIL, with space at the Site Locations in the Premises and a conducive operating environment (secure, uninterrupted, ventilated and moisture free) for the telecom equipment, and grant right of way, access rights in the Premises to install its telecom equipment, including but not limited to laying of cables, erecting poles at the roof top, or terrace.
- 4.2. To permit RJIL and its authorized personnel the right to use the common areas, stairways, ducts, passages and roof tops to carry out installation, testing, repair and maintenance activities.

To inform RJIL, at least 60 (Sixty) days in advance, of any decision by Second Party to dispose, assign or transfer its rights/interests in the Premises or part thereof to any person/party, during the subsistence of this Agreement or any extended period thereof, along with a confirmation in writing by the purchaser/transferee/assignee that the terms of this Agreement shall be binding upon such purchaser/transferee/assignee, and subsequently arranging for a novation agreement signed by the purchaser/transferee/assignee, if required by RJIL.
- 4.6. To provide an alternate space(s), in case of alteration, structural changes or renovation of the Premises, with an advance notice of at least 30 (Thirty) days, to RJIL to re-install the telecom equipment and other assets.
- 4.7. To permit RJIL to list and promote the Premises as an available telecommunication services location on RJIL's website or through any other means.
- 4.8. To provide space to RJIL within the Premises for setting up kiosks, banners, posters, standees, etc. to create awareness about RJIL's products and services, and to allow RJIL and its authorized personnel to carry out marketing and promotional activities through setting up helpdesks, organizing demo camps or road shows, within the Premises, from time to time with prior intimation to the Second Party by RJIL.
- 4.9. To not resell any of RJIL's telecommunication services or enable access to the said services to any third party apart from RJIL's Customers.
- 4.10. That individual who has executed this Agreement as the authorized signatory of the Second Party is duly authorized on behalf of the Second Party, to record the grant of and or granting of the permissions, and rights for installation of telecom equipment and for provisioning of telecom services of RJIL and it is hereby further confirmed that the authorized signatory who executes this Agreement has necessary powers and is duly authorized to sign such Agreements.

5. PERMISSION AND ACCESS

- 6.1. The Second Party will make arrangements for uninterrupted power supply with back-up to RJIL for operating its telecom equipment.

7. INDEMNIFICATION

- 7.1. RJIL shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Second Party against any actions, claims, proceedings, losses, which the Second Party may suffer due to any act or omission of RJIL in complying with rules and regulations of the Municipal/Local authorities in connection with the installation of its telecom equipment in the Premises
- 7.2. The Second Party shall indemnify and keep indemnified RJIL against any actions, claims, proceedings, losses, which RJIL may suffer (i) due to any act or omission of the Second Party in complying with the rules and regulations of Municipal/Local authorities, non-payment of any taxes, levies, etc. with respect to the Premises (ii) on account of any defect in title of the Second Party with respect to the Premises (iii) any liability for any commitment made by the Second Party to a RJIL's Customer(s) (iv) any tax, interest, penalty claims, etc, due to non-deduction/short-deduction of tax at source by RJIL from an amount paid / credited to the Second Party, if any, under this Agreement

8. TERMINATION

- 8.1. Both Parties shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving 60 (Sixty) days' notice in writing. Upon the expiry of the aforesaid 60 (Sixty) days from the date of notice, this Agreement shall stand terminated.
- 8.2. In the event of termination, RJIL shall have all rights to dismantle, remove and take away all the installed telecom equipment (including but not limited to cables, ducts, switches, routers, poles) installed by RJIL within the Premises during the tenure of this Agreement without any let, hindrance or objections, whatsoever from the Second Party. The Second Party shall not have any kind of lien or charge or encumbrance over the telecom equipment and other assets installed by RJIL at the Premises. The First Party shall take the responsibility of repairs the damages occurred due to dismantling and removal of installed telecom equipment

9. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 9.1. Neither Party shall be liable to the other for any indirect losses, punitive, special damages, consequential loss, damage, economic loss, be it in tort, contract or otherwise, including loss of profits even if the parties are advised of the possibility thereof

10. GOVERNING LAW & JURISDICTION

- 10.1. The provisions of this Agreement and the rights and obligations of the Parties under or arising out of this Agreement shall be governed by, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of India and the Courts of Mumbai shall have exclusive jurisdiction over the matters relating to or arising from this Agreement.

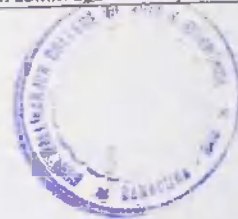

Mentoring Policy

MEANING OF MENTORING

Mentoring is a strategy to provide students with emotional and instrumental support they need to achieve learning goals.

OBJECTIVES OF MENTORING POLICY

The objective behind the programme is:

1. To provide a 'campus based role model' and a role model's message 'I will help you, be whoever you want to be.' The understanding is that the Young people need a helping hand to evolve themselves as responsible citizens and chart a success path in the career they choose.
2. The purpose is also to identify intervening mechanisms to improve the performance of weak students. In this context few ideas have been outlined:
 - a. To focus and motivate students to achieve learning goals and thereby improve their Academic performance.
 - b. To generate interest in academics and other institutional activities amongst students.
 - c. To provide students with information on preparatory courses such as bridge courses, skill courses, etc.

THE PROCESS- MENTORING POLICY

i) **Identification of weak students:** One of the Objective of Mentoring is to identify the specific Learning needs of the students. The student shall be grouped into Slow Learners and Advance Learners.



ii) Identification of mechanism to aid weak students:

Slow Learners and Advance Learners shall be identified based on the student's past Performance/Attendance/Performance in ISA.

iii) Realization of desired outcome: The Strategies to realize the desired outcome-

- a. Conduct Extra-Classes/ Revision Classes/ Practise Sessions/ Home Work
- b. Conduct Personal Counselling
- c. Assist by providing Study Material/ Reference List /PDF Material/YouTube Videos.

iv) The Mentor shall conduct Six Meets in each Term with following Agenda:

- a. Introduction/Orientation to Mentoring Programme.
- b. Orientation about Exam and E- Learning.
- c. Feedback/ Discussion on Limitations in Learning.
- d. General Counselling.
- e. ISA Results and Exam Preparation.
- f. Review of Academic Preparation.

PROCEDURE OF MENTORING POLICY

- a. All The Teaching Faculty serves as 'On Campus Faculty Mentors'.
- b. The Co-ordinator for the Mentoring programme identifies the students to be placed under each mentor.
- c. Personal One to One based meetings to be conducted as the need perceived or need felt by the student.
- d. The students to be provided with campus partners in learning.
- e. For interaction the students shall be integrated through the Whatsapp Group.

Desired result of improvement of academic performance of weak students shall be achieved by implementation of the mentoring policy procedure.
