
  Participants in the 30-hour certificate course gained a comprehensive understanding of income tax laws, enabling accurate compliance and minimizing the risk of penalties.








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### **06. WORKSHOP ON COSMETIC CHEMISTRY**

This enthusiasm during the preparation of herbal products ignited the mind of students in the direction of being entrepreneurs in the future.



Shri Roland Martin spokes on "Consumer Rights & Responsibilities as per the new Consumer Protection ACT 2019". while speaking on this he spoke on consumer rights, The first right he mentioned is the "Right to Safety" while explaining this he used the example of Roads and bus stop, he mentioned that many a time buses stops at anywhere even if there are no bus stop which may led to accidents or risk to passing vehicle as they might hit the people. He also mentioned that people should walk on opposite side while walking on a road, so one can watch a eye on coming vehicle.


Second right he spoke on "Right to be informed" he use the example of ISI marked helmet and company serial number, and guaranty card should be provided to customer and its





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customers right to know all the information on product they buy. Next he spoke on "Right to be Heard" and "Right to be seek redressal" Consumers can file a complaint in case of unfair trade practices by the seller in appropriate forums. The appropriate forums will give them a fair chance to the consumers to state their grievances. They may take the help of consumer organizations set up to protect consumers to enforcing this right.

Consumers have the right to seek redressal against unfair trade practices and exploitation. If any damage is done to a consumer, she has the right to get compensation depending on the degree of damage. There is a need to provide an easy and effective public system by which this can be done.

Ulhas Velip, an Inspector from the Department of Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs, who served as the resource person for the session.


The programme begin with introductory information about the topic, followed by topics such as artificial scarcity, false weight, duplicate goods, misleading etc. Later he spoke on non-standard weights or measures, He also mentioned about "Consumer Protection Act 1986" this particular act speaks about that it is a law meant for preserving the rights of the consumers and resolving their disputes faster as and when they arise. Not only that but also provide for the better protection of the interests of consumers and for that purpose to make provision for the establishment of consumer councils and other authorities for the settlement of consumers disputes and for matters connected therewith. At the end while talking on legal metrology he have show pictures of different weights and measures, he have spoken on verification and stamping of weights and measures, as per the law it is mandatory for every person having any weight, measure, weighing instrument measuring instrument in his





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possession which is likely to be used by him in any transaction or for protection shall get it verified once in a year and every verification certificate shall be displayed in a conspicuous place in the premises where such weight or measure is being or is intended or likely to be used, in any transaction or for industrial production or for protection . he also spoken on non-standard weights or measures, short delivery in obtaining service, short delivery in rendering service and buying and etc.

A total of 60 students actively participated in the workshop, eagerly engaging in discussions and activities led by the esteemed resource person, Mr. Ulahs Velip's expertise in consumer protection laws and legal meteorology provided valuable insights into the regulatory framework governing fair trade practices. Throughout the workshop, students gained a comprehensive understanding of consumer rights, ethical consumerism, and the significance of standards of measurement in ensuring transparency and fairness in the marketplace.

In his concluding hours he mention about packaged commodities, he have said that it is necessary there should be a mandatory declaration on packaged commodities such as name and complete address of manufacturer or packer and of importer; common or generic name of the commodity contained in the package; net quantity; month and year in which the commodity is manufactured or pre-packed or imported; the maximum retail sale price of the package (inclusive of all taxes) where size of the commodity is relevant, the dimensions of the commodity contained in the package; such other matters as are specified in the act and rules in force.(consumer care no., email )etc, at the end he have shown pictures of smudged goods and duplicate goods. After completing the theory sessions, Students were sent for the practical training conducted by the bank at Margao and Karwar branch.



The program was concluded with question answer session. Vote of Thanks were proposed by Ms. Saloni Metri from S.Y.B.Com.










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








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

Mrs. Manali taught the participants basics of Mehendi and different creative designs to b put in mehendi Art.



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






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### **Street Play Workshop**

The session concluded with a group photograph.







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






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### **Faati Making Workshop**








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to master the skill of weaving the artistic thread, to warm the crowd, to glorify the performances, to exhibit spontaneity, originality, and genuineness.

Mrs. Asha Shenvi Nagarsekar, Parent Teacher Association Member was invited as a resource person for the workshop of making Kapyaale. Patchwork is a technique of sewing small pieces of shaped fabrics, of mixed patterns, colors, and texture, all together to create larger geometric designs. Traditionally, this was a form of needlework used to create the patchwork quilt, but it is now a popular technique in clothing design and interiors. Patchwork is most often used to make quilts, but it can also be used to make rugs, bags, wall hangings, warm jackets, cushion covers, skirts, waistcoats, and other terms of clothing. Some textile artists

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work with patchwork, often combining it with embroidery and other forms of stitchery. patchwork allows the maker to use small, leftover pieces of fabric to create simple or intricate designs for a quilt. When sewn by hand, Patchwork can be portable, allowing the maker to accomplish sewing away from home. When sewn by machine, Patchwork can be a quick method of creating Quilt Blocks remarked by trainer Mrs. Nagarsekar. Mrs. Nagarsekar also commented that Kapyaale can be made of new clothes and of used clothes if followed tradition .




